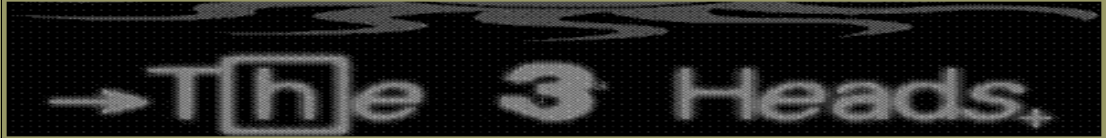

THE 3 HEADS TO RECORD A LIVE PERFORMANCE AGAIN AT THE BLUE CAFE

Back in September of 2006, The 3 Heads decided it was time to capture a live recording of the band. Working with new drummer (Aaron J. Gutierrez) Pat, Heath and Jared felt that the timing was right to captures a few tunes that had not yet been recorded in the studio. Working with Scott Gravois, sound engineer at The Blue Café, T3H were able to lay down 8 tracks that included: Cry

at Night, To the Ones , Empty Room, Listening and other tunes. Those recorded songs are safely stored away for future mixing. On February 23rd, T3H will play The Blue Café again and capture the same energy from the September 2006 show. According to Pat, "Not only are we trying to come up with some good recordings to produce a live CD, but recording live helps us ana-

lyze the songs closer to help us polish them up more for studio recordings."

There is no expected release date for the Live CD and talks of a new studio album are in the works. As Aaron puts it, " I agree with Pat, closely scrutinizing our playing will definitely help in the studio and it is always fun to capture the spontaneity of the band and the fans that come to hear us play."

Movie Project in the Works

Recently, we have been approached by Jill Hesselstine, Producer at G-Living TV, (see www.gliving.tv) about having a couple T3H songs featured on a new movie project.

Lives : Los Angeles, CA—The Westside

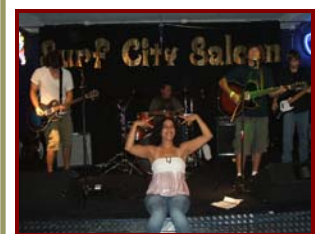
Favorite T3H song: Cry at Night.

The Album “Doolittle”, by The Pixies is one of the CDs that has influenced me most. The Pixies has a wide range of style and sound, and that is one of the reason I love them. Doolittle is the CD that best represents The Pixies. I highly recommend that you check it out.—Jared Fisher

Yeah, Kim Deal made a big splash of her own, and

Frank Black is still holding his own. But as any Pixies fan will tell you, and as Doolittle suggests (like "ten million pounds of sludge" to the head), the Pixies rocked harder than the sum of their parts. They were masters of dynamics (check out "Monkey Gone to Heaven," or "Hey"), moving from quietly subdued to all-out head-banging and back before you could say "la la love you." Black Francis was one of the most unique vocal stylists of the '80s. His duets with bassist Deal, "I Bleed" and "Silver," work

the way Ella Fitzgerald and Louis Armstrong worked together. And it's still staggering how much Joey Santiago, lead guitarist, could accomplish with one simple, single note. "Here Comes Your Man," by the way, is as straightforwardly poppy as the Pixies ever got, so enjoy it. ~Dan Leone for Amazon.com
